What are those yard flags for?

A Public Notice posted on the Village of Grass Lake Facebook page, explained that EGLE mandated that 140 Parcels connected to the Village water distribution system be randomly selected for material verification. Village DPW and USIC marked utilities to facilitate soft dig excavations at these locations. Please leave flags in place until the project has been completed to avoid costly repairs to utilities. (Water, sewer, cable, phone, gas, electric, etc.) All excavation sites will be filled and reseeded each day, no holes will be left open. Note: EGLE does not reimburse the Village for the work DPW does; the purpose is to identify materials in the water distribution system.

Budget Workshop Meeting Date is January 16

Village Council has held budget workshops one hour before the regularly-scheduled meetings for most of November and December to review the FY25 Budget draft. The next budget workshop will be at **6:00 pm** on January 16.

Previous workshops addressed several sections of the budget—General Fund, Salaries, DDA, Major and Local streets, Assets and Depreciation, and Debt Administration.

The public hearing for the budget will take place on February 20 at 6 pm. That hearing will be followed by a regular Village Council meeting at which council will vote to approve the budget. The new budget takes effect March 1.

Now is the time to contact the Village Manager and Council members over any personal concerns. As stated before, nothing replaces being in the room to hear the questions and answers that explain the funds and the logic behind proposed figures.

Government budgets are more than tally sheets, they are living policy documents determining project and priority spending in the community. The budget includes line item revenue and expenditures, by fund and department; a six-year Capital Improvement Plan; Water and Sewer Rate details, fund balances, debt and depreciation, and more—all of which direct staff regarding how to spend funds to execute policy throughout the Village.
